I. Historical Data (2010 – 2016)

II. Organizational Goals - Review and Report of Successes for 2016

1. OHSR has seconded a core of support services who work with OHSR.
2. An approved application to SK Housing and some support will facilitate growth in 2017.
3. Expectations re: FT employment resulted in 19/25 Members working after 90 days.
4. Fewer Mid-month allowances were approved, resulting in savings of about \$2,000.

Organizational Goals - Further improvement required.

1. Member Improvement Plans – Housing Supervisor needs to find ways of integrating; little success evidenced in this aspect of program delivery.
2. Fewer MIGS and more relapses – review of current practices and adjust policy development accordingly.

III. Demographics Data 2016 – 41 Members (13 Holdovers)

1. **Ethnicity** - 5 (12%) individuals reported First Nations status, 9 (22%) reported Metis status and 27 (66%) reported Non-aboriginal status. Similar numbers of individuals respectively self-report in 2015 – 4 (10%), 8 (20%), 27 (68%).
2. **Homelessness** – 33 (80%) individuals self-reported homelessness upon entry; 8 (20%) reported being at-risk.
3. **Length of stay** - increased from 6.6 months (2015) to 7.1 months in 2016.
4. **Reason for Leaving** – 17/41 (41%) Members left as a result of relapse; 8 (20%) left for no reason; and 0 (0%) left for non-compliance/breach of contract. 8/41 (20%) of permanent residents departed from OHSR as Members In Good Standing (MIGS).
5. **Average age** – 37.51 years.



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- IV. 2016 Exit Report Results** – Exiting Members provide self-assessment data collated in relation to relocating intentions data:
1. 9 of 12 (75%) respondents cited ‘move with family/friends/acquaintances’ for reasons to relocate.
 2. 11/12 (92%) indicated external factors - having nothing to do with OHSR - as the motivation to leaving.
 3. There remains a high degree of satisfaction level (85%) by OH Members with respect to the physical accommodations provided.
 4. Capacity building - 11/12 (92%) respondents indicated positive change in their ability to interact with others.
- V. Wellness Rubric** - a positive average score of 19.15% self- improvement was reported.
- VI. Outcomes Measures – Sobriety** - 15/21 (71%) Members assumed a major role in engagement/ participation in democratic House process in 90+ days.
- VII. Outcomes Measures – Self-Improvement** - 25/41 (61%) of residents at 60-91 days maintained continuous employment/education.
- VIII. Outcomes Measures – Economic Improvement** – Of 25 Members, a reduction from 19 to 4 Members required Social Services assistance from 30 days to 90 days.
